<u>Chaplain's Chatter</u>— My Chaplain's chatter comes as a reflection on the time we spent at Morningstar Mission with the precious women, children and staff at the Family Shelter. We were privileged to spend almost an hour each morning with the women who were there during the day. We also got to meet some of the other clients in the late afternoon when they came back from work and their children as they came home from school.

At first, they were pretty quiet and a little tentative to talk or share but as the week went on and our COM women shared our testimonies and love with them, they began to open up a little to us. They were thrilled with the "As You Go Bears", the drawstring bags and some satin pillowcases we offered to them. They began to tell us their stories and their dreams for their lives after Morningstar. It was an encouragement to us to see how God is working in them and in us every day.

A little fabric, a little stuffing and a short time of work can open doors for conversation

and sharing God's love. Until those women knew we really loved them and that it was not just a project to make ourselves "feel good helping the homeless", they remained closed to us but God opened doors for us to walk through and gave us opportunities to speak as we openly shared with honesty what God has done in our lives. Take those opportunities every time God presents them to you. The time is short until He returns and we need to share our story with others.

Projects completed

- a) Built walls for a new office in the dining area constructed, dry walled, mudded, painted, stained and vanished the office door and got it hung
- b) washed walls, doors and cleaned in dining areas and general public areas
- c) landscape areas raked out old mulch, removed it, removed old black landscape fabric, weeded areas, replaced mulch
- d) Treasure chest 1 thrift store built shelves, painted
- e) Treasure chest 2 thrift store cut weeds, bushes and tree stumps, built new shelves, repaired front doors with weather stripping, other repair tasks
- f) met with women in family center every morning for devotions
- g) repaired some clothing and hemmed pants
- h) made drawstring bags (completed approximately 40), As You Go Bears (approximately 40), a few good news girl dolls, bibs for infants and older children and a few Christmas ornaments for the mission.
- i) a few women went outside the mission and met with homeless waiting for services or meals and handed out bags and bears.
- j) attended a volunteer recognition banquet hosted by the mission
- k) handed out bags, bears, dolls and satin pillowcases to the residents in the family center
- I) repaired a weight bench at the mission
- m) trimmed trees outside the Women & family center
- n) cleaned & painted security door in Women & Family center
- o) cleaned & painted bathroom doors and outside kitchen doors in dining area

Fred and Jim were able to make quite a few contacts about Campers On Mission and Sonny walked through the crowds presenting the plan of Salvation.








































Please plan to participate in this rally. It is a wonderful time of meeting other COM members and the fellowship is so sweet.
