Faith Focus - The Christmas Story

Luke 2:8-14 And there were in the same country, shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flocks by night. And lo, the angel of the Lord came up-on them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, "Fear not, for I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; you shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger." And suddenly, there was with the angel, a multitude of heavenly hosts, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on Earth, peace, goodwill toward men."

Advent is a beautiful invitation. A time to slow down, quiet our hearts, and prepare for the coming of Jesus. Yet, somehow, this season that's meant to center us often ends up rushing right past us--filled with to-do lists, family plans, and all the noise that makes it hard to find stillness.

Maybe this year your heart feels a little cluttered or heavy. You want to make space for Jesus, but life keeps crowding in. You're not alone in that.

From a friend: I'll never forget the Christmas when our whole family had the stomach flu. This wasn't the sniffly kind of sick you treat with hot tea. This virus flattened us on the couch, groaning with every movement. Instead of perfectly decorated cookies and a table filled with Christmas delicacies, we had cups of Gatorade lined up on the counter and Saltine crackers on paper plates. There were no visions of sugar plums dancing in our heads, no Christmas lights twinkled. We didn't have the energy to flip the switch.

This was not the Christmas I had planned. As we all lay on the couches in our pitiful state I flipped through TV channels. I landed on "A Charlie Brown Christmas". Instead of just cheering me up, this movie provided me with the shift in perspective I desperately needed. It showed us all the true meaning of Christmas. God knew we needed this time to slow down and remember what Christmas is really all about.

The good news is that Jesus still comes--right into our mess, our weariness, and our no-quite-ready hearts-with the same message the angels announced so long ago: I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all people.

Hamilton Joint Project with Iowa COM**June 22—26, 2026**

1. Finish siding on west side, that was not finished when we were there in 2023
2. Repair siding along gym that is coming off, all four sides have siding loose
3. Power wash exterior of building
4. New curtains in sanctuary
5. Paint the wood trim white in sanctuary
6. General clean up
7. Plumbing clean up
8. Mud texture and paint drywall where windows removed in 2023
9. Add lighting in fellowship hall eliminating wall lights
10. Bathroom Update: High rise toilet, new vanity, new mirror, new floor vinyl plank
11. Add 100 amp RV receptacle for Hitching post
12. New flooring outside of fellowship hall bathroom
13. Flooring outside of offices, inside gym entrance
14. Painting and modernizing of office
15. General clean up around gym and storage areas
16. Attic access holes need repair, remove fan from one and add lid
17. Repair toilet off of nursery (upstairs).

The Great Passion Play Project List**March 15—April 4, 2026**

1. Build a storage shed near the Statue of Christ that is the same pattern as chapel
2. Build a pole type building for the new wood saw
3. Clean out current metal shop and wood shop
4. Create a new metal shop and wood shop that will be administered by COM
5. Clean up of the set—rake leaves, repair or make new set pieces
6. Decorate the set with flowers, fabric and other items as needed
7. Work on the Marketplace to refresh awnings and decorations
8. Refurbish the photo booth by the dining hall with new backdrop and decorations
9. Possibly built a second photo booth in a different location

PRAISE REPORTS

Taken from the National Campers On Mission Manual 2025

How to Praise the Lord through individual "Praise" Reports:

- When a dozen campers with an average age in the mid-seventies move onto an empty site and leave a new church building three months later, it is God, not man.
- When campers work at a fair for two weeks and experience a hundred new salvations, it is God, not man.
- In church services, individuals give praise reports by sharing what God has done in their lives. As campers, we do the same thing. We give God the praise for the things He accomplishes through us, just as He desires.
- When others hear what He has done through us, it strengthens them and brings others into the kingdom of God. Can we do any less?

We share praise reports in our newsletters, on our websites and Facebook page, with local and state associations, and with our local chapter. The more we share God's accomplishments, the more others will be strengthened. As they are strengthened, they will be encouraged to get more involved in doing God's work.

Hearing praise reports may plant seeds so that others may plant some seeds and others may accept the Lord or even join Campers on Mission. If we do our best, God will use it for His benefit. Each chapter should have its own praise report forms designed to meet their specific needs and desires for reporting God's accomplishments.
